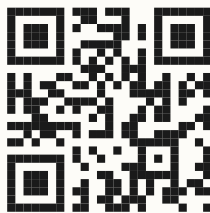


Fancy Bass Chords

Movable Shapes

Bass closed, so they move

shape root on bottom example

fifths

02xx	E	R	13xx = F5
x02x	A	R	x13x = Bb5
xx02	D	R	xx13 = Eb5
3x0x	E	R	4x1x = Ab5

major

02x1	E	R	13x2 = F
320x	E	R	431x = Ab
x320	A	R	x431 = Db

minor

02x0	E	R	13x1 = Fm
310x	E	R	421x = Abm
x310	A	R	x421 = Dbm

- Shape is the fingering above its lowest fret.
- Slide it one fret, the chord rises a semitone.
- Bottom is the degree on the lowest string.

Root Positions

- Fret for the root of each key on each string. Everything else is measured from there.

Patterns

Bass counted from the root

Root + fifth + octave The default. Works under

anything in the key.

Major arpeggio Major, maj7, 6.

degree	R	5	8	3
string	R	1+R	2+R	3+R
fret	R0	R2	R2	R1

Minor arpeggio Minor, m7, m6.

string	R	1+R	2+R	3+R
fret	R0	R2	R2	R0

Dominant seventh Any 7 chord. The b7 pulls to

the four.

Minor seventh The two and the six chord.

Walking approach Leading into the next chord.

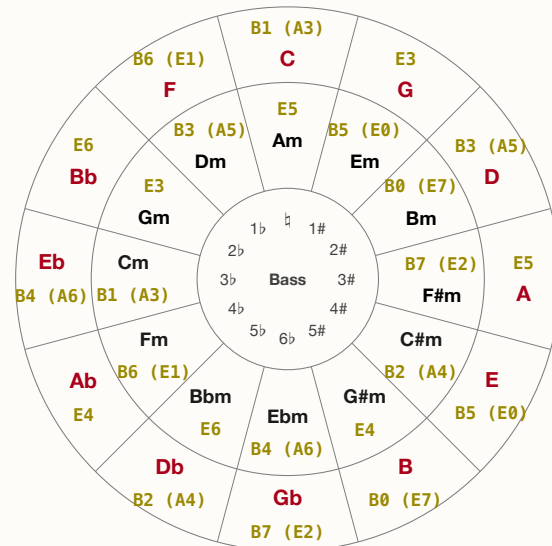

Read across: in the key on the left, the four is the note under the 4. A minor key borrows the same row, starting from its six.

Bass

Circle of Fifths



String and fret for each root: **A3** is the third fret of the A string.

Lowest that falls under the hand.

Five-string first, four-string in parentheses.

Tunings

Bass (B) E A D G

The guitar's lowest four strings, an octave down.
